### DAILY ITINERARY

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#### Day 1 Lima

Upon arrival in Lima, we will be met by our local representative and transferred to our hotel.

#### Day 2 Lima - Cusco

After breakfast at the hotel, we will transfer to the airport for a morning flight to Cusco. After settling into the hotel, the afternoon is spent walking around the quaint town of Cusco. At the elevation of 11,000 feet. There we will stroll through the narrow streets observing the massive ancient Inca-lined bases of many buildings, get acquainted with the center of town surrounded by the glorious Andes Mountains. We begin in the Temple of the Sun in Qoricancha which was the most important temple in the time of the Incas. Qoricancha is home to some of the finest stonework in Peru and is now home to the Dominicans. After a full-guided tour of Qoricancha we will walk through the city of Cusco to the main square and the Cathedral. The cathedral was constructed in the 17<sup>th</sup> century and has brilliant examples of colonial art and has the famous painting of the last supper with a guinea pig as the main course.

#### Day 3 Cusco

Today is the day of whitewater rafting on the Urubamba River!!! After having an early breakfast, we board a transfer from our hotel and drive through the glorious Andes Mountains to the southern part of Cusco and arrive at the small town of Chuquicahuana (about one and a half hours). Here we will have our safety talk and receive our rafting equipment. These Class III and IV rapids take us through the forest scenery for about 11 km. We will enjoy a picnic lunch by the side of the river and after we dry off and change clothes.

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## DAILY ITINERARY (continued)

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### Day 4 Cusco - Pisac

Leaving after breakfast, we will venture to the town of Pisac, where we will have the opportunity to see some of the most interesting types of Inca architecture in the area. With a guided tour of 90 minutes we really have the chance to understand the purpose of the construction. At the conclusion of this tour, we will have a chance to shop in one of the best markets in Peru- the Pisca Market After lunch we make our way to the town of Ollantaytambo . Here our guide will lead us for a 2 hour tour of the archaeological site showing the way the people continued living in this Inca designed town. Ollantaytambo is renowned due to the fact that these Incas resisted the Spanish invasion before running off to the jungle.

### Day 5 Machu Piccu

With an early transfer from our hotel to the train station, we will begin our trip to the Citadel of Machu Picchu. The journey through the Sacred Valley and the mountains is quite picturesque passing through many local communities.

On arrival to Aguas Calientes we take a short but very winding bus trip to Machu Picchu. Here our guide will begin our tour of Machu Picchu. The tour is a history lesson with guides that are passionate about Machu Picchu and its story. Meander around this flat-topped city, observing the many llamas that call this ancient city their home. We return to Ollantaytambo by train and then transfer to Cusco.

Today we take part in our global giving project. We will visit Mantay, a shelter for poor children. Students will have the opportunity to personally deliver goods to these needy kids.

### Day 7 Puerto Maldonado

We breakfast early and fly to Puerto Maldonado, and journey to our Amazon lodge. After a short rest, we will have a short hike to a small lagoon and return in time to enjoy a jungle sunset at Sunset Point. Upon returning to the lodge, we board again the canoes for a short night ride to spot caymans on the river banks of the Tambopata River with flashlights. After returning we will have dinner, at which the Resident Naturalists (RNs) will brief us on the Amazon Rainforest. Here the RNs can answer any questions about the flora and fauna that makes the Amazon one of the most treasured places in the world.

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### Day 8 Puerto Maldonado

After an early breakfast our guides will lead us for a 3 ½ mile hike to Cocococha Oxbow Lake. On the way, we will observe exotic plants and insects, colorful butterflies and birds, monkeys and, with some luck, even some of the large mammals. At the lake, canoes will be available for a ride around it watching the giant river otters and the wildlife on the shoreline. We return to our lodge for a late lunch. The afternoon is free for relaxing or independent activities.

### Day 9 Puerto Maldonado - Lima

We will wake very early and have breakfast. We will board the canoe to our return to Puerto Maldonado, after an exciting slice of Peruvian adventure travel, watching an unforgettable dawn down the Tambopata River. We will transfer to the airport for our return flight to Lima.

### Climate

The Andean area of Peru has a very pleasant temperature all year. June is the end of the rainy season, called "invierno" in Spanish, since it tends to rain in the afternoons. Highs will typically be in the low 70's and in a cool evening the temperature can drop to the low 50's. One has to be prepared for rapid changes of temperature throughout the day.

In the Amazon Region temperatures are considerably higher, high 80's during the daytime and the 60's in the evening. Humidity is close to 100%.

### Clothing

Mountain weather calls for layers of clothes for outdoor activities. Fleece tops or sweatshirts are very handy. A lined outdoor jacket, gloves and knit hats are useful. Hiking boots/shoes are appropriate for some of our hikes and Teva-style sandals are perfect for rafting. For the Amazon region, light clothes are a must, but also long trousers and long-sleeved shirts for our jungle walks. Don't forget plenty of mosquito repellent for rafting and river activities.

### Altitude

All travelers to Peru must take into consideration that Cusco and the rest of the areas visited are all above 11,000 feet above sea level. It is normal to feel short of breath and/or a headache the first day; drink plenty of liquids and do not overexert yourself.. The sun is also stronger, since in the Andes it is "closer" to us. Protect yourself with lots of sun block!

### Currency

The Peruvian currency is the Peruvian Nuevo Sol (PEN). The exchange rate is about 1US = 3.13 PEN. Bring lots of small dollars as they can be used on the street at small markets. I usually take lots of one's, and five-dollar bills. These are acceptable for purchasing the hand-made goods in Peru.

### Cancellation and Refund Policy
